As one of Nuuchahnulth Hawiik, we have lost an important person who contributed greatly to his community and to the entire Nuuchahnulth Nation. Mowachaht/Muchalaht is one of the Nuuchahnulth Nations who operates their government on our hawiik/hereditary chiefs

On behalf of the Nuuchahnulth Tribal Council, we offer our heartfelt condolences to the family and community of late Norman George. Norman leaves a legacy of being a leader of a strong government who worked hard on the recognition of rights and title and managing their territory for future generations.

President Judith Sayers shares, "Ha'wilth Norman George was very involved in issues outside his community in order to bring prominence to what was important to Mowachaht/Muchalaht. I often took the time to chat with him at provincial and federal meetings to hear what was of important to his people. He had a quiet demeanor, but spoke with passion and often times a sense of humor. He will be missed."

Vice President Mariah Charleson adds, " My heart goes out to all who grieve this sad loss. I send my deepest condolences to the family and community of Mowachaht/Muchalaht."
